Last year as you know we had a tiny amount of 'persistent' absences. This is something that we will be working with our EWO (Educational welfare officer) to eradicate. We make no excuses for wanting all our children to be in school every day if they are well enough to be. As discussed before the summer, please do not be offended if we contact you in person, or write to you about your children's attendance- it really is crucial.
