

TimesTables Rockstars: Next term we will be re-launching TimesTables Rockstars to help children learn all our multiplication facts alongside all the other great things we do in school. Like many things over time, children can lose a bit of interest in things and after a couple of years, where our children seemed to be on TTRS every day, trying to break all manner of records, this for some children has not been a priority. Next term we will re-introduce this to all year groups and will be running a

range of competitions and who knows the existing school records may be broken! TTRS alongside FunKey Maths Cards means that we will definitely be able to learn all 38 facts that are needed to help us in Maths. You never know even the adult rock legends may return! (You may have to ask some of the older children about this!) Last week in Friday celebration assembly, Lakshan, in Year 1 confidently shared that $9 \times 9 = 81$ in front of the whole school, and we know that this is something that can be replicated by lots of other children and all children can learn some facts from their starting points. Help your children get ahead in Maths and keep learning multiplication and division facts! The enjoyment of learning maths, I saw myself today at lunchtime when two children in Year 5 - Ferlyn and Abigail decided to use our magnetic whiteboard to do more Maths- well done girls! (Every long multiplication was correct and this is Year 6 work!)









Flying High at St.Helen's: Our children continue to amaze me, with some of the work they produce and their enthusiasm for learning. Just this last week I have seen some amazing Maths work in Year 1 in doubling numbers and yesterday when teaching Year 6, I was blown away by the standard of writing and the progress that the children have made across the year.

This represents itself in lots of house points and last term we had the closest house points race ever with just 3 house points separating Concorde and Brabazon House in 1st and 2nd Place. (Concorde will get their treat in a couple of weeks time, as we have already had lots of dressing up with Break the Rules Day and the planned dressing up on World Book day. This means that the house points total for the whole year is very close and we look forward to seeing how many more house points can be achieved. Well done to every child in the school!

A reminder if you have any concerns over behaviour that your children are seeing or experiencing (there were a few comments to teachers at parent's evening this week.) Please do not leave it to these meetings but arrange to see your child's class teacher or even better arrange to meet myself as soon as you have a concern, so that we can discuss any worries that you may have. We want all our children to be Flying High, but all our staff also pride ourselves on helping and supporting those children who may find this a little bit trickier. Most weeks in this newsletter I ask people to make contact with me if you have any issues, this doesn't always happen but I, like all staff members, would much rather hear or know of any issues straight away so that we can deal with the issue and reassure you rather than let 'things' fester. Thank you for your continued support on this. My door is always open!
