Whilst we know that there has been severe colds, sickness and general illness, we've also seen an increase in holiday and absence requests. Currently we have 8% of children classed as persistently absent (lower than last year, which is good, but we still want it to be lower) and an incredible 94 children (45%) of our children whose attendance is 97% or above.
