From Mr Chappell Over the last few weeks, we have started to conduct our parent/carer tours for prospective parents for September 2024, and at these times it always reminds me of how incredibly proud I am, of all our children across the whole school as our visitors are shown around by some Year 6 children. Things have not changed much in terms of the tours from when you may have had one. I still share about our school values briefly and then the visitors are shown on a tour by children, where every classroom can be visited and visitors can ask our children any question to get an open and honest answer, away from any other adults. Visitors always come back praising the things they have seen around the school, for example the children's work, behaviour and engagement and talk about how the children were so polite showing our school values. Whilst doing these tours it reminded me of the importance that we place on the home school relationship- the triangulation of support for the child to do as best as they can (see below.) It is important to remember, and I certainly acknowledge that we don't get everything right, that we need your support not only when things go well but on occasions when things are not working so well. Please can we remind you, that if you have any concerns, about anything, for example worries about your child's work, concerns about behaviour in school that you might be hearing about from your own children or worries about how your children are developing socially etc please come to us directly and immediately! When things are brought to our attention, we do try to resolve any difficulties that you or your child may be experiencing as soon as we can and hopefully it results with a satisfactory resolution. If you are in any doubt about anything, please just contact us, then we can ensure all children are Flying High by working together in partnership.
