

Anti-Bullying: A reminder that we do not classify an incident/s between children as 'bullying' unless we are following the school's anti-bullying policy, and a clear system is being followed. Not all incidents between children are bullying incidents. We are very open about when incidents occur in communication with all parties but it is important that you as parents/ carers (and also the children) are clear that we do not use the term bullying for isolated incidents, unless we have met together officially to log it as bullying together and are monitoring any potential difficulties following the school policy.
