'They will soar on wings like Eagles – Isaiah 40:31'



Parent / Carers' evening: January 13th and 15th.

Thank you to everyone in Years 1 – 6, who has already booked a Parent/Carer Evening appointment. As you know, we changed the date of these meetings to give you more precise information about your child's attainment and next steps, so that you can better support them at home.

At the end of Term 2, some year groups have completed more formal assessments. During your appointment, teachers will be able to share details of your child's progress and what they can work on next to improve further. You will also receive your child's attendance certificate, so that you are fully aware of their attendance data.

While we understand that children may be absent from school due to illness, we have noticed that, in a small number of cases, attendance is dropping due to inconsistent patterns – such as one-day absences every couple of weeks – which can disrupt learning. Although attendance can be a sensitive issue, please be assured that everything we do is supportive. Even when it becomes necessary to involve the Educational Welfare Officer (EWO), this is done with the aim of supporting families and helping children achieve their potential.

As of today, the whole school attendance stands at **95.88%**. A huge well done to Year 6, who have an impressive attendance record of **97.56%**. Although 95.88 % is slightly lower than our end of Term 1 data, we are still above where we were this time last year and currently above this year's national primary attendance which is 95.07%. Attendance is rightly a big focus in schools and is a key target for the Department for Education (DfE). Research shows that attendance plays a significant role in children's GCSE outcomes, so every day really does matter!

In preparation for OFSTED, I looked at 'career' attendance of all our children - that is, their attendance over their entire time at St Helen's. The results are fantastic: the current Year 5 and 6 cohort have no child below 90%, and 20 out of 60 children have achieved attendance of over 97% across six or seven years. This is brilliant and certainly demonstrates our Flying High ethos! Attendance really does matter!
