#### From Mr Chappell

Once again walking around the school corridors, it has been so nice to hear and see all the great enthusiasm that children have been putting into their learning. As we edge ever closer to the summer holidays, it has also been great to see some of the work that has been posted on Tapestry and Class Dojo by those children who are continuing to work really hard at home. Well done everybody!

As you may have seen or heard, at the end of the last week the government released guidance to schools about planning for September. As I've previously mentioned, we have, as a partnership Health and Safety committee, been meeting every fortnight to review our current systems in school. Yesterday we met again, and we hope to write to you with our thoughts and plans about September by Monday 20<sup>th</sup> July. The final newsletter of the year will be sent next Thursday.

**Reports:** In recognition of all the children's hard work, within school and outside school during the lockdown, teachers have worked incredibly hard over the last few weeks to develop a school report for every single child. We have thought very carefully about what is presented in the reports and, in line with Government guidance about 'reporting to parents' in the current climate, we have decided to continue to send out reports in a similar format to previous years. For those children who have not been able to get back into school, teachers have written comments based on the children's work over the first four terms and, alongside this, we will report on children's assessment up to the end of Term 3, which was our last collected data point. Please note we are not predicting where children would have been at the end of the year but have decided to report the most accurate assessment data that we have, based carefully on concepts that the children have covered in school. For those children who have been able to return to school since the opening weeks of June, assessments will be based on information up to the end of Term 3 and any other assessment information teachers may have gathered over the last month or so. More information about this system will be provided in the letter accompanying your child's report.

### Collection of reports – Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> July

The vast majority of reports will be able to go home with children who are currently in school or with siblings who are in school. We have thought carefully about other means to let you have the reports, such as emailing or posting, but have decided that the best way will be for parents and carers to collect them, following social distancing protcols. We can then also let you have other things, such as PE kit, which may still be in school and also some curriculum books. The parents of children in each year group have been allocated a time to arrive at school and, following our current one way system and maintaining social distancing protcols, you will be able to come onto the school playground to pick up your child's report. If it is raining we will use the covered area.

Year 3 children: 2pm to 2:20pm	Year 2 children 2:30pm to 2:50pm

For the small number of children from Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 who are not currently attending school, the collection time is **1pm on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> July.** 

Please note that we will not allow other parents to collect reports on your behalf.
