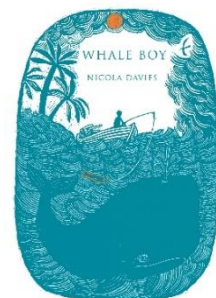
Emotional Wellbeing
