After the successful trial of Class Dojo by our Year 1 and Year 5 classes, we were delighted to roll out this online platform to the rest of the school at the end of last week. A huge thank

you to everybody for engaging on the platform; an amazing 96% of families are signed up and we have loved seeing the work, photos and videos that have been posted. The number of photos and video shared has been unbelievable and far exceeded our expectations, so thank you for sharing your children's work and staying connected.

As you can see, since we introduced Class Dojo to the whole school well over 1,000 photos and videos have been shared and more than 500 messages have been sent by teachers. During the school closure, Class Dojo will remain the key point of contact between yourself and your child's class teacher. Please note, it is not possible for class teachers to make a comment on every single thing that is uploaded. Whilst the teachers have to approve every post that is submitted, they will not mark or make a comment on everything.
