From Mr Chappell:

Welcome back to what we hope will be a great Term 4 and the rest of the school year. As we edge ever closer to the return date we cannot wait to see all the children back in school. This week we have spent a long time, as a leadership team and a staff team, thinking about the children's return to school and what this looks like practically and for the work that is being planned in the classroom. Early next week, we will let you have details about our plans and, although a 'road map' has been given by the government for trying to return to normality in the summer months, the reality is that we are very much still working within very tight guidance to keep everyone - children, parents, and staff - safe. Procedures that we currently have in place, such as the one way system and staggered times, will remain. However, following our review, some of the times for different year groups may change.

Although we cannot wait for the children to return, whilst we are awaiting further restrictions to be lifted, it is important for us all to remember that we should still follow the rules of lockdown outside the school gates. We know it could be very exciting to see friends again outside the school gate (and especially in the park when the sun is shining) but, whilst we are doing everything we can to keep staff safe in school (including four different staff rooms as staff cannot mix), we need everyone – children, parents and staff - to still be following lockdown rules that are set to keep us safe. Please play your part by following the rules on the playground, outside the school gates and in the park, all areas where there is potential for 'mixing' when the children return. Thank you for your support with this.

Partnership 'Guiding Principles' for return: 3 principles:



Wellbeing	Supporting health - Emotionally, mentally and physically

Times Table Rockstar Carlton Van says a huge well done to every child who has made an amazing effort over the lockdown to learn their multiplication facts. A few weeks ago we introduced the first ever TTRS trophy. Well done to the following classes that won the TTRS trophy to keep in their classroom for the week.
