


From Mr Chappell

Cherry Class 'Walking for WaterAid'

As part of their topic 'What is fair?', the children in Cherry class have been looking at the supply of water around the world and raising awareness of how some children aren't as lucky as us and can't just turn on a tap for their water. Some children walk an average of 3.7 miles each day to collect clean water. To help with the understanding of the topic, the children took part in a walk to Mrs Woolford's house in Alveston, with a small bucket, to collect water and bring it back to school. Thank you to their family and friends for sponsoring them – they raised an incredible £549 for WaterAid.
