KS1 reading message:

Over the last couple of weeks the children in Year 1 and Year 2 have really enjoyed choosing their own reading books to take home. It has been great to see them engaging in conversation with adults and their peers about what kind of books they like and what book they might choose next. As a reminder, books are changed on a Monday and a Friday but please ensure reading books and reading records are in school every day. This week we have relaunched the '5 times a week' competition and it has been good to see lots of children reading at least 5 times a week to an adult. It would be amazing if we could have 100% of children reading at least 5 times a week across KS1. Once your child has finished reading their book you can spend some time focusing on retelling and asking questions. Don't forget to record this in the reading record. Bookmarks with the children's reading targets will be sent home shortly; please refer to these targets when writing a brief comment.

Speed and accuracy are so important when it comes to times tables and related division facts. The more facts your child remembers, the easier it is for them to do more challenging calculations.

Over the last 7 days, the following houses have played this often:

- Blenheim 19%
 Britannia 23%
- Concorde 27%
- Brabazon 31%



Next week, let's all **Fly High** with practising our quick recall of times tables and related division facts by aiming for as close to 100% as possible. The house which plays the most often will receive a house point for every percent they achieve. For example, the winning house will achieve 95 house points if 95% of the children play over the next 7 days. Good luck everyone!
