Wow! What another busy week! Over the last few weeks we have had two school trips, the introduction of certificates for NumBots in KS1 (KS2 - don't forget to keep going on Times Tables Rockstars!) and our new KS1 reading challenge. Also, teachers have been working in each other's classrooms to learn from each other, to help ensure our Maths teaching is the best it can possibly be. On Monday, I had the pleasure of accompanying the Year 1 and 2 children to Noah's Ark Zoo Farm in Wraxall, as they looked to develop their knowledge of animals and their habitats. Throughout the day what struck me most was the children's thirst for learning and how well they represented our school and our 'Flying High' values. These 'Flying High' values were also seen following the Year 5 and 6 trip to the Armstrong Hall in Thornbury to watch Macbeth, when I was delighted to receive an email praising the behaviour and manners of our children. One helper on the trip said **'Sometimes I am still blown away by the children's natural politeness'** which is delightful to hear.

Also this week I received a lovely letter from a member of the community, praising the actions of two of our children, Ava and Isla, who looked after an elderly neighbour alongside their parents, after the neighbour had a bad fall. The letter stated *'for them to act as caring and considerately as they did is a great credit to them, their family and the school'*. One of our values is 'compassion', and the girls certainly showed this in abundance. As you know, there are many things that make me proud to work in this school, and the behaviour and attitude of our children and the way they conduct themselves is one of them. This week we have seen many of our children 'Flying High' in lots of ways. Have a great weekend.
