Connected Curriculum Theme: Global Neighbours

**Context:** The lives of significant individuals in the past, including local history. Geography of a small area of the UK (Bristol) and of an area in a contrasting non-European country (The Bahamas).

Some Facts (Knowledge & Understanding) Skills
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Isambard Kingdom Brunel lived around 200 years ago during the Victorian Age. He was a famous engineer whose designs changed the lives of many people. Brunel's first job was helping his dad design a tunnel to go under the River Thames in London.

People wanted to travel faster between places such as from the capital, London, to the city of Bristol. His Great Western Railway made this possible.

We still use some of the bridges and railway stations built by Brunel. Even though people don't sail on his ships anymore, you can still visit the SS Great Britain. **Communication** - Children will be able to participate in discussions that affect self, others and the wider world by stating opinions and starting to give reasons for these in addition to listening carefully to others.



**Critical and creative thinking** -Children will ask relevant questions and consider merits of different viewpoints. They will use different approaches to solve problems.
