Planning

I can look at examples of writing, discussing its **layout**, **vocabulary** and **grammar** and use them to help plan my own writing.

I can choose how to note down my ideas, using research when necessary.

Reviewing and editing

I can discuss and evaluate my writing and make improvements.

I can use my **grammar** and **spelling** skills to check and **edit** my writing.

I can perform my own writing using appropriate **intonation**, **volume** and **movement**.

Drafting and writing

I can identify the **audience** and **purpose** of my writing and select the appropriate form for my writing. A historical narrative.

I can write an interesting **plot** in a narrative from beginning to end.

I can develop **setting** and **atmosphere** in detail. Using descriptive vocabulary and varied sentences.

I can develop **characters** in detail. Through using dialogue or describing characters' reactions to events.

I can write detailed **free verse poetry** of increasing complexity, with specific **purpose**. Narrative poems.

I can select and use a range of **narrative** language features throughout my writing. Using dialogue to advance the action.

I can select and use a range of **non-fiction** language features. **Generalisations: Many** people argue...

I can select and use **organisational features** in fiction and non-fiction.

Balancing action, using bullet points.

I can make links between **paragraphs**. Use of appropriate connectives or repetition.

I can link **sentences in a paragraph**. Using connectives, pronouns; linked points or arguments.

Grammar, vocabulary and punctuation

I can use **expanded noun phrases** to add detail to a piece of writing.

I can use **precise** word choices. The beetle scuttled.

I can use **adverbs** to show how likely something is to happen.

Surely, perhaps, possibly.

I can use **modal verbs** to show how likely something is to happen. Should, could, may

I can use **figurative language** such as **metaphors, personification and repetition** for effect.

I can use **embedded clauses**. Tom, although he was terrified, crept through the forest.

I can use **relative clauses** beginning with who, which, where, when, whose and that. It's a fine day out that everyone will enjoy.

I can change the position of a **subordinate clause** in a sentence for effect.

I can use the appropriate **tense** throughout a piece of writing, switching between **past** and **present** when necessary.

I can use the appropriate subject specific language in different text types.

I can use **commas** accurately to separate **clauses** in **complex** sentences.

I can use **inverted commas** and other punctuation to indicate **direct speech**.

I can use reported speech.



Spelling I can spell my key words. I can spell **homophones**. I can spell words using **prefixes** and suffixes. I can use the first 3 letters of a word to check spellings and meanings in a dictionary. I can use a **thesaurus**. **Presentation** I can write fluently and legibly with speed and a personal style.
