Planning

I can look at examples of writing, discussing its **layout**, **vocabulary** and **grammar** and use them to help plan my own writing.

I can choose the quickest and easiest way to **research** and make notes using a selection of sources.

Reviewing and editing

I can discuss and evaluate my writing and make improvements.

I can use my **grammar** and **spelling** skills to check and **edit** my writing.

I can perform my own writing using appropriate **intonation**, **volume** and **movement**.

Drafting and writing

I can identify the **audience** and **purpose** for my writing and select the appropriate **genre** or mix of **genres**.

I can maintain more complex **plots** with a series of events, and use dialogue to advance action. Flashback stories etc.

I can develop **settings** and **atmosphere** in detail. Through effective word choice and varied sentence length etc.

I can experiment with and write a range of more sophisticated **poetry**.

Narrative poems, sonnets, odes.

I can select and control a range of **narrative** language features to write an effective story. Using language to control time and pace

I can select and control the use of **non- fiction** language features.

Rhetorical questions; passive voice.

I can select and control the use of organisational features in **fiction** and **non-fiction**. Developing some paragraphs in more detail; deciding on the most effective order of points in an argument.

I can make links in and between paragraphs.

Grammar, vocabulary and punctuation

I can use **expanded noun phrases** to add detail to a piece of writing.

I can use ambitious vocabulary precisely to give additional detail, create impact and make something clearer.

I can use the passive voice.

I can use **figurative language** such as **extended metaphors**, **detailed personification** and **colloquialisms**.

I can use a range of sentence structures, including sentences with **multiple clauses**.

I can vary sentence structure and length to add detail and create specific effects to engage the reader.

I can use the appropriate verb tense to show time and cause in my writing, using the **perfect tense of verbs.**

I can use formal structures in speech and writing. Including the **subjunctive**. Doctors suggest that people take regular exercise.

I can use **semi-colons** or **dashes** to separate clauses accurately.

I can use a **colon** to introduce a list and **semi-colons** within a list.

I can use **inverted commas** and other punctuation for **direct speech**, **reported speech** and **quotations**.

I can use **hyphens** to avoid confusion.

Man-eating shark or man eating shark.

I can punctuate using **bullet points** consistently.



Spelling I can spell **homophones**. I can spell my key words. I can spell words using **prefixes** and suffixes. I can use the first 4 letters of a word to check spellings and meanings in a dictionary. I can use a **thesaurus**. **Presentation** I can write fluently and legibly with speed and a personal style.
