At St Helen's we know that children will only learn well if they feel happy, valued and safe.

High academic standards, excellent progress and attainment in reading, writing and maths are a real priority for us as these skills are essential in preparing children for later life.

We also believe that one of our main roles is to inspire learners, to engage them fully in their learning and follow their interests and passions.

We provide children with a rich, exciting curriculum through trips, engaging topics, the use of our amazing woods and other outdoor spaces, through sport and in the arts.





Extra Curricular Learning

These activities provide children with the chance to try something new, learning alongside other children and developing new skills.

We have a variety of after school clubs, including many different opportunities for sport. These include two gymnastics clubs, two Football clubs, Netball and Sports Heroes for our younger children. In addition to this, we offer peripatetic music tutition in a variety of different instruments.

St Helen's is situated in a fantastic environment, with playgrounds, a large field and our own enclosed forest area and pond. The Reception outdoor area was redeveloped and launched in September 2015. We look to make the most of our outdoor space whenever possible.





Inclusion

It's important to us that every child reaches their potential, whatever their needs may be. We work hard as a staff team to build strong relationships with children and their families and to provide learning opportunities that are appropriate for every child.

We have an inclusion leader who is focussed on identifying children who may require additional opportunities or support to reach their full potential. This may involve access to one-to-one tuition, working in a small, focused support group or a place on a 'Gifted and Talented' course at a local secondary school.

We have a team of dedicated and experienced Teaching Assistants who fulfil a variety of roles in school, including offering specialist learning support.





Ethos and Behaviour

Children behave well at St Helen's and follow our 'Flying High' behaviour code.

We aim to promote good behaviour through a weekly Celebration Assembly, house points, certificates and praise, and address inappropriate behaviour through clear, consistent, stepped sanctions.

Our children are members of a house team, with a weekly house trophy awarded to the team with the most points. Children compete in houses during the year, with other children from different year groups, developing leadership and team spirit.

The behaviour of pupils is good.
They are courteous, considerate
and supportive of each other.

This is exemplified well in their behaviour at playtime which, while lively and happy, demonstrates that pupils are aware of the needs of others and adapt their play accordingly.

Partnership and Provision

Primary education is most successful when there is a strong partnership between school and parents. We aim to work closely together and to be available to talk both informally and also more formally, through parents' evenings and meetings.

We provide advice on supporting your child's learning at home and also encourage parents to help in classes, around school and on school trips.

Our breakfast club runs every morning from 7:45am until the beginning of school. We also have an 'After School Club' that runs on our site, providing care until 6pm.

We know how important a good start is. It sets the foundation for the rest of school and so we work closely with children and parents as part of our induction programme. There will be opportunities for parents and children to visit the class in the summer term, before they start in September. This helps them to settle guickly and develop good relationships.

In Reception, children learn in many different ways, both inside and outdoors. Activities are fun, engaging and play based, ensuring each child achieves their potential.

Children have opportunities to follow their own interests and plan their own learning and we want them to leave Reception with a love for learning, feeling confident and increasingly independent as learners.
